3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "E-Poll Book Improve-5 ment Act of 2007".

3 (a) REQUIRING ELECTION ASSISTANCE COMMISSION
4 TO DEVELOP AND ADOPT GUIDELINES.—Part 3 of sub5 title A of the Help America Vote Act of 2002 (42 U.S.C.
6 15361 et seq.) is amended by adding at the end the fol7 lowing new section:

8 "SEC. 223. DEVELOPMENT AND ADOPTION OF GUIDELINES 9 FOR ELECTRONIC POLL BOOKS.

10 "(a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after the 11 date of the enactment of this section, the Commission 12 shall develop and adopt voluntary guidelines for electronic 13 poll books, in the same manner and in accordance with 14 the same procedures under which the Commission devel-15 ops and adopts voluntary voting system guidelines under 16 this part.

17 "(b) ELECTRONIC POLL BOOK DEFINED.—In this section, an 'electronic poll book' is an electronic mecha-18 19 nism (including stand-alone software) by which an election 20official at a polling place, at the time an individual seeks 21 to vote, may obtain information on the individual's eligi-22 bility to vote (including whether the individual is reg-23 istered to vote in an election for Federal office, the polling 24 place to which the individual is assigned, and whether the 25 individual has already voted in the election), whether the mechanism is operated by integration with a voting system
 or independently.".

3 (b) ROLE OF TECHNICAL GUIDELINES DEVELOP4 MENT COMMITTEE.—Section 221 of such Act (42 U.S.C.
5 15361) is amended by adding at the end the following new
6 subsection:

7 "(g) APPLICATION TO GUIDELINES FOR ELEC-8 TRONIC POLL BOOKS.—This section shall apply with re-9 spect to the voluntary guidelines for electronic poll books 10 developed and adopted under section 223 in the same 11 manner as it applies to the development and adoption of 12 the voluntary voting system guidelines.".

(c) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of contents
of such Act is amended by adding at the end of the items
relating to part 3 of subtitle A the following:

"Sec. 223. Development and adoption of guidelines for electronic poll books.".

19 Section 231(a) of the Help America Vote Act of 2002
20 (42 U.S.C. 15371(a)) is amended by adding at the end
21 the following new paragraph:

22 "(3) COVERAGE OF ELECTRONIC POLL BOOKS
23 UNDER CERTIFICATION AND TESTING OF VOTING
24 SYSTEM HARDWARE AND SOFTWARE.—For purposes
25 of this section, an electronic poll book (as defined in
•HR 756 IH

section 223(b)) shall be treated as part of the hard ware and software of a voting system, without re gard to whether or not the electronic poll book oper ates by integration with a voting system or inde pendently.".
